#### **Letter From Your President**

Hello, Members and Friends of North Parish Quilt Guild!

Welcome April with longer daytime and (hopefully) warmer weather. I am looking forward to seeing everyone in person again at our April meeting on **April 10**.

It seems like it's been forever since we got together in December. Although we did meet in person for charity drop offs and charity sewing, and had three Zoom meetings, nothing compares to just getting together in person for a meeting with raffles, munchies, Show and Tell, speakers, and the comradery of quilters chatting and comparing projects. Yes, welcome April and our in-person meetings! Be sure to bring your projects for Show and Tell! Bev Cook will be our featured guest speaker.

At the March meeting, a member asked that we discuss holding our March meeting next year in person instead of by Zoom. Please think about the issue and come to our April meeting with comments and ideas. Things to consider in moving to in person in March 2025:

- The comradery of meeting in person, sharing our projects, and learning together is difficult to reproduce in an online meeting; however, some members have transportation and travel issues in winter.
- Weather: The weather in March in unpredictable, while this year we had good weather the day of the meeting, the previous two years there were ice storms or snow on the meeting day.
- Increased costs of the renting the hall- to add an additional meeting in March, we will pay an additional cost for the hall and janitor, about \$110 per

meeting (\$875 for 8 meetings). Some of this cost is offset by the in-person revenue generated by the raffles.

 Speakers: while we (generally) pay more for speakers for our zoom meetings, we can hire more nationally known speakers or speakers who have unique topics and live outside of our local area, (and who charge travel and lodging for our in-person meetings). Local speakers may be less expensive, but our choices are limited on speakers with new topics. An option would be to have two nationally known or distant speakers for January and February by zoom, and move the charity sew along or member led activity to March in person.

These are my thoughts. I am interested in yours! Please come to the April meeting prepared to discuss whether to meet in person or continue by zoom for next year, and if we have enough members present, vote at the meeting, or in May, before we renew with hall for next year.

We still need volunteers for officers and coordinators for next year. Open positions are Vice President, Secretary, Raffle Table Coordinator, Snack table Coordinator, Membership Coordinator, and Hole in the Wall Charity coordinator . If you would like to help, but can't commit to the entire year, we welcome your support and whatever volunteer time you are able to give the Guild. Please reach out to me and we can discuss your availability for one meeting, a few meetings, or the entire year.

Be sure to follow us on Facebook! And as always, feel free to reach out to me with thoughts, suggestions for the Guild.

See you in person on April 10.



# Yawkey Way Home and The Veterans Hospital <u>Veterans Charity Update.</u>

We are constantly making and submitting quilts and clothing protectors to the Veterans Hospital for the Veterans. This week Lenny Poirier delivered over 200 clothing protectors to the Veterans and half of them were from the members of north Parish Quilters. YEAH – thank you for all the hard work and support.'

We will continue to make bibs for the Hospital, but the real need for these clothing protectors is not as needful as last year – thanks to all quilters who supported this project. We have delivered over 1,700 clothing protectors – in total to the Veterans Hospital. They recently informed us that now the clothing protectors are being laundered right at the facility in Bedford. they have obtained washers and dryers for specific units, including the dining room. Now the turn-around for the bibs is not as urgent as before – however, we will continue making clothing protectors and, Lenny will have kits available at the April Meeting.

Huge thanks to Lenny Poirier who has been cutting the fabric and making up all the kits for the clothing protectors – he deserves an outstanding ovation for this. Thanks to Lenny from the bottom of my heart.

#### Yawkey Way Home Update.

We continue to make quilts and pillowcases for the children and families at the Yawkey Way Home. On March 15, I delivered 12 Quilts and 12 Pillowcases from North Parish to Yawkey Way Home.
